Enhanced Access Service:

Appointments are available with the Enhanced Access service and can be booked for weekday evenings and at the weekends. The service is based at another Practice location in Bath. These enhanced access appointments can only be booked through our Practice reception team.

Urgent Care Centre and Out of Hours

The Urgent Care Centre is based at the RUH in Bath and is open 24 hours a day. This service is located next to Accident and Emergency at Royal United Hospital, Combe Park, Bath, BA1 3NG

Life-threatening conditions

Don't forget: Always dial 999 for life-threatening conditions such as:

- Choking
- Suspected Stroke
- Fitting or concussion
- Drowning
- Severe chest pain
- Severe difficulty breathing
- Severe burns or scalds
- Unconsciousness
- Severe loss of blood
- Severe allergic reactions

For 24-hour advice on health conditions and the availability of local services, you can dial **NHS 111** at any time day or night.

Minor ailments and conditions

You can get rapid advice and treatment from a local pharmacy

The pharmacist may be able to provide medicines for these conditions:

- Ear-ache
- Teething and nappy rash
- Threadworms
- Hay fever
- Cold sores / mouth ulcers
- Coughs, colds, sore throats, blocked nose
- Athletes foot
- Diarrhoea
- Skin rashes
- Emergency contraception
- Eye infections
- Thrush and uncomplicated Urinary Tract Infections

Where possible call in at your local pharmacy and ask to see the pharmacist. If you have difficulty finding a pharmacy, you can use the NHS Choices website, www.nhs.uk or dial 111

Doctors

General Practitioners (also known as GPs, and please be aware that a GP is a Doctor), Nurse Practitioners, Nurses and Health Care Assistants provide medical treatment for patients with routine injuries and illnesses as well as offering preventative care and guidance on areas of health promotion. The University Medical Centre now also has an Advanced Paramedic Practitioner working with the Practice.

The University Medical Centre has both male and female Doctors available and you may book an appointment with whichever doctor you wish to see depending on the availability of appointments at the time of booking.

You may only be referred to a hospital, whether on the NHS or privately, for tests, treatment or to see a Consultant if a referral has been arranged by your doctor and it is considered appropriate for your individual medical circumstances.

You should see a nurse where appropriate.

Please note all appointments with a Doctor or Nurse are for one problem only.

If you feel you need a longer appointment, please discuss this with the receptionist at the time of booking.

You are requested not to eat or drink during your time in the Practice or during your consultation and if you arrive late for your appointment, you may be asked to rebook.

Nurse and Paramedic Team

Nurse Practitioner:

A Nurse Practitioner is able to examine, diagnose and prescribe for a wide range of conditions including the following:

- Minor illnesses including sore throats, rashes, fever, ear pain, eye problems, skin or wound infections. Diarrhoea and vomiting
- Injuries: acute injuries and wounds, swelling or bruising
- Travel and child immunisations. Post travel diarrhoea
- Contraception – new or continuing
- Fitting of Nexplanon implants and intrauterine devices.
- Emergency contraception
- Sexual Health Screening

Advanced Paramedic Practitioner

The Advanced Paramedic Practitioner can manage the acute primary care needs of patients of all ages. This may be via telephone advice or video consultation or during a face-to-face clinic appointment in the surgery. They are able to manage acute neurological, respiratory, gastrointestinal, dermatological, ENT, paediatrics, musculoskeletal disorders and mental health conditions as well as facilitate repeat prescription requests and manage patient referrals.

Health Care Assistant:

- Blood tests
- Stop Smoking
- Flu and pneumonia immunisations
- Health Checks
- Dressings
- Suture/stitch or clip removal

Practice Nurse:

- Asthma Review
- Diabetes Review
- Contraception
- Travel Advice & Immunisations
- COPD Review
- Severe burns or scalds
- Cervical Smears

Social Prescriber:

The University Medical Centre also has a Social Prescriber. They focus on patients' social, emotional, and practical needs, such as loneliness, financial instability, or long-term conditions, and help them engage with community groups and services to improve their overall health and resilience.
